

Who Are We?






Empathy Compassion Understanding

Our school productions cover important topics. For primary schools this includes online safety, British Values, diversity, and cyberbullying to name a few. For secondary schools we address knife crime, social media, AI, sexual harassment, domestic abuse and more.








KS1 & KS2

We tackle some of the most prevalent issues facing children today through our productions and workshops.

These productions last approximately 45 minutes – 1 hour, with accompanying workshops at 45 minutes. Within a tour day, productions can be delivered twice in one school or once in two neighbouring schools within five miles (who then share the cost of the booking).

In Their Shoes is a unique production and workshop that celebrates and promotes unity in diversity and sensitively explores issues around extremism. A play written and produced with multi-faith partners, it is in itself an example of what can be achieved when different people come together and use their abilities for the same goal.

The Spots and the Stripes have always hated one another for no real reason other than that they are different. After a particularly heated argument with a Spot, one Stripe is convinced that she must find people who can help her stand up to the Spot. However, as she searches she meets characters who tell her stories from different cultures and religions about how it is possible to get along, despite being different. As she listens, the Stripe is challenged to spend time in her neighbour's shoes and see a potential friend, instead of an enemy.







How We Work

- An enquiry through phone, email or Saltmines online form is received.
- We contact the school with more information and agree on a provisional date for the booking.
- 3 Our Tour Coordinator will send a booking form to complete, with an accompanying email which gives details of length of performance and workshop and length of set up time and pack down time needed.
- On receipt of the completed booking form and for secondary schools, as and when any queries about the space have been resolved the booking is confirmed.
- Our Tour Coordinator will be in contact with the school near to the time of the visit to plan a schedule which fits into your school's timetable.
- 6 After the visit, we invoice the school for the total cost.
- Finally, we send through our online evaluation form: please do take a moment to complete this as we always want to develop and improve our service to schools.

For some productions there are additional resources available, for example a letter to parents or an Education Pack. We will liaise with each school regarding when it would be appropriate to send these through and if a cost is involved.

Saltmine Trust promotes the productions and workshops we will be touring within a financial year via this Education Pack, our website and social media platforms, and by promotional emails.
